Proposals for workshops

1. **Orchestral work** by Ingeborg Poffet:

Two types of concepts will be worked out: one is the piece "Lab-Cats", first performed at the FIM-Festival 2013 (see YouTube), the second is about intuitive conducting the orchestra. Lab-Cats is an improvising concept with an image as score (a labyrinth with various entrances and exits with musical snacks), conducted by Ingeborg.

2. Orchestral work by Jopo Poffet:

Two pieces will be elaborated during the workshop and performed during the evening concert. The first one is CRARC, an improvising concept especially written for EIMC 2025, and the second piece will be NEIGHBOURS, first performed at the FIM-Festival 2013 (see YouTube). CRARC is about listening and how to act together musically with care and NEIGHBOURS is about different circumstances, as it can be seen in every house, where different people are living side by side. So in CRARC we have absolutely free decisions concerning the context while NEIGHBOURS has many rules and aspects in advance (stimulating vs. determining).

3. Stockhausen's Intuitive Music by Carl Bergstrøm-Nielsen:

Karlheinz Stockhausen (1928-2007) wrote 51 text scores during the years 1968-70 which he called "intuitive music". They contain a number of precise and simple designations of what to play, condensed from his know-how of experimental music processes. There are metaphorical, poetic words suggesting atmospheres - and instructions aiming at meditation. We will explore a few of these scores. They provide opportunities to work very focused, and at the same time in a large intuitive space, as their final sounding form is always that of the musicians. 4. EIMC Electro-Acoustic Relay by Etienne Rolin:

I wish to record and use snippets from the Day 1 musical presentation of each participant. Such fragments will form the basis for a recomposed tape material that invites soloist, small groups and the whole ensemble to react artistically to. The tape will be reacted to with sound and silence, high density and rarefaction, using a Sampo (https://www.sampo.fr/). Durations: 1 min (maximum) per participant will be used in a tape superposition for a total of 12 to 15 minutes; 15 mins time for for listening and analysis; 15 mins time for Interaction with solos and small groups; 15 mins for a tutti that will in fact be a double tutti Concerto for orchestra granted the mixing of live and pre-recorded material; 15 mins time for discussion. In total one hour of a hopefully energising session.

Nota bene: Certain group dynamics and cues for entering and exiting may be used borrowing a few simple techniques from John Zorn (Cobra Cards) and Walter Thompson (Soundpainintg gestures).

The two mixed improvisations will of course be recorded for later listening and sharing comments and impressions.

5. Children's workshop by Ingeborg Poffet:

The workshop is intended to a group of 7-17 children in the ages of 7 to 17 years old. No specific knowledge nor skills are required.

After a short "getting in the mood" I want to develop a story-board together with the children and their ideas in a circle, starting form the youngest. Meanwhile we'll discover fitting sounds for details of it – with small instruments, that everyone can bring along (but it's not required), vocals, kitchen stuff, papers, clothes etc. Even rhythms might be experienced, small songs/ samples/studies might be included, also using body-language, body-percussion and/or beat-boxing and others. The participants of EIMC will take part or listen to it.

Try-outs of ideas

If you have some idea for improvisation that you think is not suited to devote a complete workshop to it, there is the possibility to use the free formation space for it. Just ask some participants to join you.

What do we expect from you...?

- We like that participants do really take part in the activities of EIMC-2025 in order to create a coherent group.
- During the activities, we like that you put your mobiles away as far as communication concerns. Of course, you are welcome to take photos or videos.
- Unnecessary to say, we think free improvisation is about equal communication. It is about the sound of the group and we are free to take an equal part in it.

Meals during EIMC-2025

We will have vegetarian lunches and dinners in Het Wijkpaleis. This is included in the conference fee (there is no opt-out), as is coffee and tea during breaks.
